Michael Schneider

Schneider, Michael: Born, Dec. 15, 1835.

Mr. Schneider was born Dec. 15, 1835 in Harbach Frankfort, on the Rhine, Germany. He came to the United States, arriving at New Orleans, in March of 1857, after 58 days on the ocean. In September, 1865, he reached New Cassel. He became employed as the manager of the Findeisen Elevator in New Cassel, making the first grain purchase for the elevator. He managed the elevator until the railroad was constructed in 1873. He then went to work for the railroad helping to build the Northwestern Railroad through Campbellsport. After this, he left Campbellsport for the Dakotas to buy and sell grain until 1893.

He purchased 157.62 acres of land in section 6 of the township of Auburn sometime before 1893 and later purchased the 40 acres in the NE 1/4 of section 7 of said township.

Schneider, Casper- was born in the same place as his brother in Germany.
To find his exact age you would have to write to the New Orleans library on shiplog records.
Or New York library to find the ship log records of Ellis Island of his port of entry.
