The data in this folder was entered on computer by Diana Wichman in Autumn, 2005. It was noted that there were quite a few spelling and other errors. When it was possible to determine the correct spelling of proper names, corrections were made. In some cases, an entry which appeared to be in error was copied as it was written. Ordinarily, we wrote [Sic] or [As written] after the word to indicate this.

The Equipment Purchase of the department of 75 years.

1905

In 1905 a horse drawn pumper was purchased and a horse cart with 1000 feet of hose from the Ripon Fire Department.

1906

In 1906 a second hand hook and ladder & chemical tank and cart was purchased from the Ripon Fire Department.

1914

On Friday November 6th a 60 gallon chemical tank was purchased and it pushed a stream for 14 minutes.

1920

Monday evening March 2nd 1920 the village board purchased a Model "T" ford truck, from the Howe Fire Engine Factory in Anderson Indiana at a cost of \$3,242.50. A potential of 500 G.P.M.

1926

May 17th there water cisterns were approved by the village board. The dimensions being 24' long, 8' wide 10'deep. The sidewalk to be 10" thick 4" bottoms, the top 8" with reinforced steel and with an enclosed man hole.

1928

The cisterns were built on the south east corner of Elm & Mill St. The cisterns were built on the northside of Kippengs Garage lot. The cisterns on the corner of Ladwig St. & Fond du Lac Ave.

1931

On Thursday October 29 1931 a Reo Speed Wagon was purchased and with a 500 G.P.M. Laverne Pump from Leischer Brothers of Loganville, Wisconsin at a cost of \$4,385.00

1932

In January a Fedocade Siren the first electric fire siren was installed by Ernest Kloke for \$69.50.

1934

Jan 12-3 Canvases were purchased to cover furnishings at a fire.

1934

March 12 The first telephone was installed in the old fire house for receiving fire calls.

1938

The department purchased 500 ft. of 2 ½ hose and 12 new firemen's coats and firemen hard hats.

1939

The department purchased 4 acres of land from Fred Schmidt for park purposes.

1940

The General Motors 500 G.P.M pumper, front mount was purchased.

1944

The department purchased 6 steel helmets. Also 250 ft. of 1 ½" hose was purchased.

1945

The department purchased coats and boots and also 2 dozen fire brooms.

1948

A fee was set for cap and badge. On August 18th additional land was purchased from the Schmidt estate.

1949

Playground equipment costing \$400 was purchased and erected in the park.

1951

The department purchased 3 water stock tanks for use in hauling water to country fires.

1952

The boy scout cabin was completed in the firemen's park.

1953

The membership was closed at 36 at the July 16th meeting. A Dodge fire truck chassis was purchased from Howard Motor Company.

1954

Two Indian pumps and brooms were purchased. Three acres of land were purchased from the Schmidt estate directly from the park.

The village hall, firehouse, clerks office, library and village garage was completed and dedicated. On March 2nd an ambulance was purchased. The park little league diamond was developed Herbert Pieper, Victor Del Pont, and Roderick Reese.

1955

The park concert posts and chain hangers were installed by Rolland Hensen and Arthur Yankow. Trees were planted by the department in the park. The arch bell tower was

constructed at the park entrance and supervised by Roy Ours. A larger fire siren was purchased by the department. The park pond was developed and concreted in May and June.

1956

A Chevrolet truck was purchased to replace the Reo Tanker.

1957

Caps with gold braids were purchased for the officers. A Cadillac ambulance was purchased to (replace the Buick ambulance). A rotating flasher was purchased for the street corner.

1958

Restrooms were built in the park.

1959

First bowling team sponsored by the department. The Muscular Dystrophy drive was established by the department.

1960

A fire department sign was installed on the garage. Insurance coverage was provide for department members at the February 15, meeting.

1961

October 14, Fire contracts were established for townships. January 19th 1961 Four Scott Packs were purchased.

1962

A new chassis and John Beam volume and high pressure pumper was purchased.

1963

Stickers for car identification were purchased. A new hamburger grill was purchased for department use.

1964

A new electric motor type ejector was purchased. A new portable pump and two new Indian pumps were purchased.

1965

On January 16 to the 20th the 10th annual Badger Firemen's bowling tournament was held at King Pin Lanes Campbellsport WI.

1966

A new fire phone system was adopted for 8 phones. A new John Deere lawn mower was purchased. In January the department established a permanent fire number 5334141.

1967

The aerial ladder truck and a John Beam volume and high pressure pump was purchased on a Ford chassis.

1968

A new riding mower was purchased from KleinHans implement. A new Oldsmobile ambulance was purchased.

1969

A 1967 Ford chassis and a 2500 gallon stainless steel tank were purchased for the department for hauling water.

1970

White jackets were purchased for ambulance personnel. Three additional fire phones were established.

1971

One dozen picnic tables were constructed. A ¾ ton International truck and John Beam 200 gallon tank and high pressure pump was purchased.

1972

A portable resuscitator was purchased.

1973

A pole type building was erected in the park. Established plaques for men who served over 25 years: Lester Butschlick, George Miller, Harlow Roate, Clem Kleinhans, Edward Ours, Earl Scheid, Alvin Waldschmidt, Benno Miller, Roderick Reese, David Twohig, Sylverius Wetslaff.

1974

Purchased a new John Deere Mower for the park. The department has developed 4 ambulance and rescue squads, and a two-way radio tower was installed.

1976

Erected the second pole building. . Purchased and built the second water supply tanker. Purchased a new John Deere mower.

1977

Purchased 6 pocket scanners

1978

Purchased a new John Beam High Pressure pumper with new type of cab for riding firemen. Endorsed 911 system of communications established by County Board of Fond du Lac.

Meeting called to order by Albert Schwandt
MSOC that Albert Schwandt act as chairman of this meeting. M.S.O.C. that Wm Martin act as secretary of this meeting. The object of the meeting is to organize a volunteer fire department. The constitution and by laws of the old department was read by the chairman.

1st formal ballot, total votes 19. Choice-10 C.R. Vande Zande-3, A. Schwandt-4, Wm 11, A Sukawaty-1, Wm elected.

1st informal ballot of 1st Asst. Chief Total votes cast 19, choice 10. C.R. Vande Znde 4, J. Granger 10, W. J. Sullivan 3, E. Curran 1, Blank 1.

M.S.O.C. that the informal ballot be declared formal and John Granger elected 1st Asst. Chief.

First informal ballot on 2nd Asst. Chief Total votes 19, choice 10. Emmet Curran 15, Wm Martin 1, W.J. Sullivan 1, H.J. Paas 1. Blank 1.

M.S.O.C. that the informal ballot be declared formal and Emmet Curran elected 2nd Asst. Chief.

First informal ballot on Secretary Total votes 18, choice 10. Wm Martin 17, H.J. Paas 1. M.S.O.C. that the informal be declared formal and Wm Martin elected.

First informal ballot for Treasurer Total votes, 18, Choice 10. Glass 9, E. Sen. 5, Math Schlaefer 2, Ray Wenzel 2. read and approved. M.S.O.C that we adjourn.

M.S.O.C. that we adjourn until Thursday Dec. 10.

M.S.O.C. that we the chief appointed a committee of three to investigate first formal ballot. Total votes 18, choice 10. E.P. Glass 12, M. Schlaefer 1, Ed Sen. 5. E.P. Glass elected Treasurer.

M.S.O.C. notify that the secretary Wm. of his election of Chief and the date of the next meeting in writing.

M.S.O.C. asked that the Secretary write to the State Fire Marshall for the duties of the Chief of a Volunteer Fire Department.

M.S.O.C. asked that we adjourn until Jan.7, 1914 7:30 o'clock.

The Park Development of the Fire Department. *(From the hand written yellow sheets)*

We were then ready to put the storm sewer pipe into the park. They were told to put a 36" pipe in a 24". The fire department installed the storm sewer pipe from the north line spring in 1953-54.

In 1955 the dept. built the concrete pond and finished it just before the picnic in July.

In 1949 Victor Del Ponte & Roderick Reese worked the little league diamond in the park and it took a lot of land fill for its completion.

They squared out the diamond and established the transit point for drainage.

For a number of years the diamond sank and had to be refilled with top soil because of all the springs under the park land.

There were many firemen that helped plant the trees and helped take the large trees that were around the front of the park.

The firemen helped establish the electric poles along the outside of the park, and also in the picnic area. We helped cut out the dead trees and clean the leaves and dead limbs every year for over 50 years.

The men set up the picnic stands every year and saw that the area was cleaned up for the picnic. The new Firemen are always used for the regular games of the picnic stands, and the boy scouts would resend some money for the clean up of beer & soda bottles in the park.

The fire department worked to establish an area for relief when there was some problems for police work out when there was water needed when the electric power was shut off any length of time.

In the early years the firemen put up the Christmas decorations and took them down again.

The Campbellsport Fire dept. basket ball team raised money for different needs of the community.

The Campbellsport Ball teams played many games for raising money for high school use.

When there was any burning of grass, brush, or old buildings the fire dept. was on the spot to take care of it and established the safety in handling the problem. For many years the Fire Dept. has established a better relationship with the town board for better fire protection of fire in the township area.

The new members today have better training and better equipment to fight all the different fires today.

When there were any problems with the flood waters at the dam the fire dept. the men would sand bag the dam on the west side so that it wouldn't wash out. The water from the inside of the fire house was always there for any emergency use.

Many of the firemen would bring there working tools along for over 50 years so they wouldn't have to look around for the right tool.

1977

In the fall budget of the Fond du lac County Board they set aside a Contingent fund of 50,000 for 6 county rescue units and approved of \$6,000 per unit for there purchase. The rest of the money which is \$14,000 would be kept as a rescue fund. The Campbellsport Fire Department excepted this program at there March 14th meeting in 1978.

1978

The Fond u Lac County Board County Board Committee on Ambulance and Rescue has assigned the budget money to the Fire Departments that are in most need of new vehicles and will follow up with working to purchase two units every year until the departments are filled with there needs of units. The county board will then establish a budget to compensate for any additional units over a period of future years. The 911 communication report will be made at a later time by the assigned committee.

Ordinance no. 32 passed at this meeting, providing for the constructions of a waterworks systems, and for the issuance of "General liability Boards" and "Waterworks Bonds" and for the purpose of submitting to the electors of said Village, Ordinance No. 33 passed at this meeting, providing for the construction of a sewerage system and the issuance of "Sewerage Bonds" for said Village and for the purpose of submitting to the elections of said Village for approval. Ordinance No. 34 passed at is meeting, providing for the construction of a sewage disposal Plant and the issuance of "Sewage Disposal Bonds." And the Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to give notice thereof and provide ballots therefore, all as provided by law.
