

Chapter 282

Fireworks

[HISTORY: Adopted by the Village Board of the Village of Campbellsport Ord. No. 117, 1956 (Ch. 14, Art. II, of the 2008 Code). Amendments noted where applicable.]

§ 282-1 Sale or use prohibited; exception.

The sale of small consumer -class 1.4G fireworks are allowed within the Village limits. All other firework classes are prohibited to be sold..The use of class 1.4G consumer fireworks are allowed within the Village limits. Prohibited class 1.4G fireworks are fire crackers and Chinese lanterns. Other non 1.4G fireworks may be used if 282-2, 282-3, and 282-4 are satisfied. Reference the latest addition of The American Pyrotechnic Association Document 87-1 for the classification of 1.4G fireworks.

§ 282-2 Permit for display.

[Amended by Ord. No. 253, 1997]

Fireworks, or other devices not included under § 282-1, may be used and displayed in open fields, public parks, private parks, or on rivers, lakes or ponds, or as a part of the conduct of a play, opera, circus or similar entertainment by public authorities or by organizations that have been granted a permit for such display by the approval of the Police Chief, Fire Chief, and Village Board. Each application for such permit shall be referred to the Police Chief and Fire Chief, who shall inspect the location. If either Chief reports the location is unobjectionable from the standpoint of fire hazards and safety, and the public authority or organization understands that a team of firefighters and/or professional pyrotechnic expert approved by the Fire Chief will discharge the fireworks, the Village Clerk-Treasurer may issue the permit upon the receipt of applicable fees. Such permit may be granted for a period not to exceed six days and shall specify the name and address of the applicant or applicants and the location where said fireworks are to be used along with the scheduled date and time of the display A copy of each permit shall be filed in the office of the Village Clerk-Treasurer. If it is determined that the fire or police department presence is required on premise for the execution of the display for public safety, additional fees may be required based on level or response required.

§ 282-3 Certificate of Liability Insurance and Property Owner Letter.

Included with the Fireworks Permit Application, must be a Copy of Certificate of Liability Insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000 for bodily injury to any one person, in the amount of \$5,000,000 for injury to more than one person and in the amount of \$2,000,000 for damage to property that may arise by reason of use or discharge of fireworks under the permit. The Village shall be named as one of the insureds in said policy of insurance. A letter of the property owner authorizing use of property for the discharge of fireworks must also be included.

§ 282-4 Proximity to gasoline pump or station.

Fireworks to be used under such a permit shall not be stored, kept, sold or discharged within 500 feet of any gasoline pump, gasoline filling station, or gasoline bulk station, or any structure other than motor vehicles in which gasoline or other volatile liquids are kept in quantities in excess of one gallon.

§ 282-5 Removal by Village.

The Village may remove or have removed all items exposed for sale or held in stock in violation of this chapter. After five days' written notice to the owner, the same may be confiscated by the Village if not removed from the Village limits by the owner.

§ 282-6 Exceptions.

This chapter shall not apply to articles used by railroads or transportation companies, or to high

explosives used for blasting or similar purposes, when used solely for the necessary conduct of construction, transportation, manufacturing or industry, nor to the conduct of the affairs of the army, navy or militia. Civil groups, churches and Village entities are exempt from permit fees. A background investigation fee may be charged as deemed necessary by the Police Department.

§ 282-7 Violations and penalties.

Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any of the provisions of this chapter shall be subject to the provisions of § 1-4.

Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption, approval, and publication. Adopted, recorded and approved this 18 day of March 2019.
