Special Board meeting which was held in the Campbellsport Village Council Room,  
177 E. Main Street, Campbellsport**

Item#1- Meeting called to order by President Twohig at 6:00 P.M.

Item#2 – Notice given to Campbellsport News, National Exchange, Post Office, Library and posted at the Village Hall and in compliance with the open meeting law.

Item#4 – Clerk, Diane Lemke informed the board members that she had a meeting with the employees who carry the health insurance and explained different plans and proposed plan to keep United Healthcare and only change would be a co-pay for office visits and emergency room visits after deductible is met.

**Motion** by Tr.Krebs, seconded by Tr.Del Ponte to change the United Healthcare health insurance benefit to include \$30 copay for office visits and \$250 copay for emergency room visits subject to deductible being met. Ayes-7, Noes-0

Item #5 - **Motion** by Tr.Schellhaass, seconded by Tr.Schickert to go with new contracts with WE Energies for the removal of 3 lights(77-11152, 06-06586 & 70-32636) and poles on Mill St. between N.FDL Ave. and the deadend and reinstallation of two lights (93-05886 & 78-0960)on the north side of Mill St. east of Helena St. Ayes-7, Noes-0

Item#6 – Clerk Diane Lemke reported the ambulance write-off for Workers Comp last month was for one person. Fax copy of review analysis showed \$500 was for unlisted ambulance service and rate is not certified by dept. based on accumulation of data for service. Clerk will check with Fire Chief when he returns from out of state.

Item#7 – Before moving into Closed Session Chief Tom Dornbrook from Fairwater/Brandon explained his background in law enforcement. He has been in field for 33 years. Dornbrooks' description of a chief is the community caretaker. Dornbrook said he spent 13yrs in Campbellsport growing up. He feels a chief and the police dept. play a very important role in a community to control drugs and the people who move in and stay in the community. People get to know you and respect the rules. Chief Renee Schuster of Oakfield said she is a home town gal from Oakfield. She reiterated that a community gets to know you and trusts you. Local police presence is a great asset to a small community. When you are not around problems swell/grow and get out of hand. When you know the kids especially when a school in is your community police can assure the protection that families look for when locating and growing up with small children.

Chief Tom Dornbrook, Chief Renee Schuster and Officer in Charge Jay Zautner left before the board members went into closed session.
