



Regular Village Board Meeting Minutes
Monday, January 11, 2021 – 6 pm
Campbellspport Municipal Center
Community Room – 470 Grandview

- 1) The meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm by PR Krebs
- 2) Notice was posted at the National Exchange Bank, Campbellspport Library, Municipal Center, Village website.
- 3) Pledge of Allegiance
- 4) All Board members were present. Vacant seat still open
- 5) Motion by Reseburg, seconded by Hafemann to approve the consent agenda with a correction to the Dec. minutes regarding the ice rink announcement wording. Motion carried, 6-0.
- 6) Motion by Hafemann, seconded Reseburg to approve the 3 operator licenses Presented for Piggly Wiggly. Motion carried, 6-0.
- 7) Motion by Zielieke, seconded by Reseburg to approve payment of invoices including January tax settlement amounts, totaling \$1,027,156.72. Motion carried, 6-0.
- 8) Motion by Jarmuz, seconded by Zielieke to give public works discretion to adjust the snow plowing policy as needed depending on each storm for the business district – also giving notice to the business owners. Motion carried, 6-0.
- 9) Chief Dornbrook reported that the new body cameras are in and being used – audio and video are excellent. We can store data in house now. Redaction software needs to be purchased – may be able to share the cost with other municipalities. 2015 SUV had leaking water pump replaced. Will advertise 2011 Crown Vic on Gov Deals auction site.
- 10) Order of names drawn for the April ballot. Hafemann will be listed first followed by Zielieke.
- 11) Craig Olson was sworn in for his 11th term as Fire Chief
- 12) Motion by Zielieke, seconded by Jarmuz to choose the crosswalk option that crosses New Cassel just north of Columbus Parc Ct. as part of the Hwy Y reconstruction. Motion carried, 6-0
- 13) With the strength that Covid 19 has hit California, Chief Dornbrook is having trouble contacting General Code regarding the ordinance updates.
- 14) Motion by Hafemann, seconded by Jarmuz to adopt the continuation of business description in Ordinance 2019-3 Chapter 186 Alcohol Beverages to include that a business must be open a minimum of 1,000 hours per calendar year. Covid 19 will be taken into consideration for this year. Motion carried, 6-0.
- 15) Well 3 pump update – The pump is in Texas being inspected and updated as needed. Price of pipe needed is increasing so DPW has secured the needed amount now – any extra can be returned. Only operating on well 4 right now.



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- 16) Motion by Jarmuz, seconded by Zielieke to accept the letter of interest from Dan Boldt to serve as trustee for the remainder of the term vacated by Brandon Serwe. He will also file the necessary paperwork to be a registered write in on the April Ballot. Motion carried, 6-0.

- 17) Citizens/business owners in attendance asked for an update on the Hwy. 67 project. All we know at this time is that about the end of February/beginning of March they may begin to line the sewer laterals with the official street reconstruct beginning the end of March/beginning of April. The DOT is planning virtual information meetings soon. We will contact them again to find out when.

- 18) Announcements:
 - a) There will be a Personnel meeting soon, Chair Jarmuz has a list of items for discussion.
 - b) The Fire dept. burned a brush pile at Columbus Parc on Sunday 1/10 and plans to burn another pile or 2 on 1/17, weather permitting. Piles may smolder for a couple of days after each burn. Residents should not be alarmed.

- 19) Motion by Zielieke, seconded by Jarmuz to adjourn at 7:50 PM. All in favor
