- 1 The meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm by PR Krebs
- 2
- 3 PR Krebs also announced that the Public Hearing that was to be held at 6:00 pm to discuss the possible dog
- 4 park was cancelled
- 5
- 6 Notice was posted at the Campbellsport News, Library, Municipal Center, and on the Village website.

- 8 Pledge of Allegiance

- 10 All Board members were present
- 11
- 12 Motion by Hafemann, seconded by Serwe to approve the consent agenda Motion carried, 7-0.
- 13
- 14 Motion by Hafemann, seconded by Wenzlaff to accept 2 new operator licenses for 2020-2021 as presented.
- 15 Motion carried, 7-0.

- 17 Motion by Hafemann, seconded by Reseburg to accept the Class “B” fermented beverage application for Artsy
- 18 Fartsy, 2020-2021 Motion carried, 7-0.

- 20 Motion by Hafemann, seconded by Jarmuz to approve invoices for payment in the amount of \$107,079.40
- 21 Motion carried, 7-0.
- 22
- 23 Chief Dornbrook reported that Officer Fritsch has resigned his position with the Campbellsport PD.
- 24 Dornbrook is still working on the ordinance revisions which will take at least another month.
- 25 The Police Dept. has had a lot of big cases to handle this month.
- 26 The internet/jet packs have not been working in the squads.
- 27 The new computers are in and will begin installation on 7/14/20.
- 28 Dornbrook would like to switch the IT work for the police dept. to the Fond du Lac County IT dept.
- 29 He is planning to have shelves built in the evidence room in the garage with an estimated cost of \$1,200.00.
- 30 The flag theft case has been solved due to a tip received by the Police Dept. Two individuals that were
- 31 intoxicated admitted to taking the flags and will each be charged with 6 counts of theft of property.

- 34 Staab Construction of Marshfield WI. Motion carried, 7-0.

- 36 Motion by Serwe, seconded by Wenzlaff to approve the pay request from August Winter for work done on the
- 37 Blower project at the WWTF in the amount of \$182,455.00. Motion carried, 7-0.

- 39 Motion by Serwe, seconded by Jarmuz to approve the pay request from H I. S. for work completed on the
- 40 Library roof in the amount of \$21,290.40. Motion carried, 7-0.

43 \$17,500.00 to study and make recommendations regarding the drainage problems on N Poplar & W Mill St.

47 if the congregation pays 1/3 of the estimated \$4,500.00 cost. Motion carried, 7-0.

49 Motion by Reseburg, seconded by Jarmuz to accept the recommendation of the Plan Commission to re-zone
50 parcel V02131999NC31200 for Doug & Carolyn Volz from Single family residential to Commercial. Motion
51 carried 6-0, Zielieke abstained

53 Motion by Zielieke, seconded by Jarmuz to accept the recommendation of the Plan Commission to zone parcel
54 T031318121201000 which has been annexed to the Village as Commercial zoning. Motion carried 7-0

56 Motion by Serwe, seconded by Hafemann to accept the recommendation of the Plan Commission to grant a
57 special exception to James Fischer/On Site Repair LLC to operate an automobile repair shop at 102 S
58 Railroad/133 W Main St. Motion carried 7-0

60 The discussion on the dog park will be held on another date.

62 Motion by Zielieke, seconded by Jarmuz to table the revision of Ordinance Chapter 11, Section 19 Outdoor
63 Serving Areas. Motion carried 7-0

65 Motion by Serwe, seconded by Jarmuz to accept the resignation of Officer Erik Fritsch. Motion carried 7-0

67 Motion by Serwe, seconded by Hafemann to approve the revised Ordinance 2019-48 for Lakeside Municipal
68 Court to include the Town of Oakfield and to update the Intergovernmental Agreement. Motion carried 7-0

70 Feuerhammer easement update – the Easement paperwork is still in the hands of the attorneys to settle
71 changes the Feuerhammer family wants to make. We have not heard from our attorney – Matt Parmentier.

73 President Krebs appointed Tristy King to fulfil the remainder of the Plan Commission term of Phil Scarpace
74 which expires in April of 2021

76 Announcements

- 77 • Krebs announced that the WE Energies expense of \$150,000.00 for moving the light poles for the Hwy.
78 67 project to be reimbursed by the DOT will be discounted from the parking lane paving portion of our
79 invoice from the DOT.
- 80 • Krebs announced that the ownership disagreement of the lot north of the Mill Pond is still up in the air
81 and that Scott Theisen wants the Village to pay him \$10,000.00 for the portion he believes is his.
- 82 • Pat Twohig let the board know that there is still a group of volunteers working to clean up the trail at
83 Columbus Parc. The trail itself also needs repair of the culverts and additional fill. We may be able to
84 get some funding in the future from Fond du Lac County for that project.



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- 85 • Gruber announced that the Campbellsport High School is planning work at their tree lot on Hwy. V. We
86 may be able to get some trees from them to replace some of the dead trees removed along the
87 Columbus Parc trail if we assist in moving them to the Parc and the Elementary School.

- 89 Motion by Hafemann, seconded Wenzlaff to move into closed session. Motion carried 7-0

- 91 Motion by Hafemann, seconded Wenzlaff to move into open session. Motion carried 7-0

- 93 Motion by Zielieke, seconded by Serwe to approve the hire of Jaritza Caraballo as a police officer pending the
94 outcome of her scheduled exams.

- 96 Motion by Hafemann, seconded by Zielieke to adjourn at 8:49 pm carried by voice vote.
